Beautiful Eucharist








This lesson was a good reminder that the Blessed Mother is always around us, even in the everyday aspects of our lives!

Middle School Family Faith & Confirmation Prep Off to a Great Start!

On October 15 and October 22, the faith year got off to a rousing start for the families in our Middle School, Confirmation Level 1 and Confirmation Level 2 children!



The 23 families in our Confirmation Level 2 program are using *Pflaum's Gospel Weeklies Visions* resources as they are formed to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation next spring. Faith Formation begins with Mass each Sunday at 6 p.m., followed by a session exploring the day's Gospel message. Our first meeting on 10/15 was a "Getting to Know You" session with games and icebreakers. The teens will also be able to hear from various guest speakers in ministry throughout the year and will be assigned home activities to experience with their parents.





The 39 families in the Middle School and Confirmation Level 1 program are utilizing the home-based *Pathways Mercy*, focusing on the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy, a vital part of formation for the Sacrament of Confirmation. Families will hold sessions at home and will also gather for a few sessions as a large group here at the church.



During this past Sunday's session, the families worked on a service project, making Blessings Bags filled with items they donated to benefit recipients in need through the *Hope One* organization. They also created inspirational and encouraging notes, which were included in the bags.







Before working on this project, the families viewed a video of Beth Vecchio, the parish's Food Rescue Ministry Leader, providing her own witness of how she was inspired to her life of service. Beth's inspiring message provided encouragement to the families, saying that service "doesn't have to be big": it simply involves seeing a need and filling it when the opportunity arises. Even sitting with a lonely child in the cafeteria is a valuable service.
